





 National Forests




Top Areas for Waters and Program Overlap

- 3) Northern Sierras Lassen Foothills




Opportunities in the larger Klamath Watershed

Opportunities in the Los Padres NF Area


- 1) Los Padres NF Fire Settlement Funds

- 4) BLM and USFWS property adjoins




Opportunities in the Lassen Foothills Area
