Day 2 - Project Site Visit- Yellowjacket Creek

TU, working in partnership with Jackson Family Wines, completed a high-priority project on Yellowjacket Creek, an important Russian River stream which flows on the Jackson family's Kellogg Ranch in the heart of Knights Valley. The Yellowjacket Creek project restored fish passage to almost two miles of high-quality spawning and rearing habitat above a concrete weir and spillway apron, which was a total barrier for migrating Coho salmon and steelhead. The upper reaches of Yellowjacket Creek are spring-fed, have cold water, and are perennial even during severe and successive drought years — perfect for juvenile fish. The project constructed a series of 33 boulder step pools and installed a new fish screen at the diversion structure. This project was funded by Jackson Family Wines and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife's Fisheries Restoration Grants Program. Other members of the project team included NOAA Fisheries, FlowWest, and Parsons Walls. The Yellowjacket Creek project completed its construction phase in October 2018. Steelhead have recently been observed spawning in Yellowjacket Creek in the project area. (TU Website Article on the Project by Sam Davidson, 2019)
