

MEMBERSHIP OVERVIEW

The California Fish Passage Forum is comprised of signatory agencies, which commit to participating in the Forum through our MOU. Signatories assign a designee to represent their organization at the Forum. Signatories are encouraged but not required to assign an alternate member, who can participate in addition to, or in replace of the designee. The entire Forum membership comprises the Steering Committee, while most day-to-day Forum operation is through monthly subcommittee meetings. Forum members are encouraged to join at least one subcommittee.



The Forum would occupy 5-10 hours/per month of your time depending on the types of tasks and events throughout the year.



Typical tasks include determining current and future Forum priorities, reviewing funding applications, providing perspectives on fish passage issues, and helping organize virtual and inperson informational and outreach events.



The Forum meets at least annually at various locations throughout California. Hybrid options are offered whenever possible, however in person-attendance is preferred.
